Family Service League Inc. is an 82 year old non-profit, non-sectarian, community-based human service agency.

Established in 1926 in Huntington by a group of women concerned about their community, they were incorporated by New York State in 1930

to address problems of child welfare, unemployment and poverty.

Family Service League's Mission: helping individuals, children and families to mobilize their strengths and improve the quality of their lives at home, in the workplace and in the community.

Today, FSL manages one of the largest and most comprehensive networks of care across Long Island. They serve infants to elders with innovative programs that advocate for and empower people and communities. The agency operates 51 different programs located in 20 different communities that stretch from Mineola to Greenport and East Hampton on the East End. These include:

- Children and Youth Programs
- Family Support Programs
- Vocational Programs

- Mental Health Programs
- Senior Service Housing
- Homeless Services

In 2007, FSL services reached approximately 47,000 adults and children. Although they serve a broad spectrum of people, the vast majority of their work is with parents and children who are from poor and low income families.

FSL is governed by an active 39 member Board of Directors and staffed by 526 (full and part time) skilled professionals, para-professionals and support personnel. More than 800 volunteers support the work of the agency as program volunteers, fund raisers, professional and community advisors.

FSL is accredited by the Council on Accreditation for Children and Family Services (COA), a national standard-setting organization, for meeting the highest standards for services, administration and financial management. FSL is the only agency in Suffolk County, and one of only two on Long Island, to be awarded this rigorous and prestigious accreditation.
